Summary of Findings

Since 1994 Skills Canada British Columbia has provided tens of thousands of BC students with opportunities to explore, mentor, be mentored and compete in skilled trade and technology career programs.

To fully understand the impact that these programs have had on engaging and developing trade & technology focused youth, SkillsBC partnered with Banister Research to undertake a province-wide study that included input from students, educators, government and industry stakeholders.

The purpose of the research was to assess the impact and the overall effectiveness of SkillsBC programs and events in influencing young people's perceptions of, and decisions to, pursue trade and technology careers in the province.
