#### **Provincials 2021**

Due to ongoing social distancing requirements, SCBC will not be able to use the Tradex for the Provincials 2021. Therefore, Provincials 2021 planning continues to evolve. Skills Canada BC will be flexible with dates/times of the competitions to allow for maximum participation. It is likely that most of the Provincial competitions will take place remotely with planning to judge the competitions remotely using zoom and other live/remote software.

#### **Provincials 2022**

Skills Canada BC is working with the Vancouver Convention Centre and the Skills Canada National office to see if it would be possible for Skills Canada BC to host its Provincials 2022 in this facility, days prior to the start of the Nationals 2022. Doing so, would save the National office time/money in setting up the Nationals. Hence, there may be some cost-sharing initiatives that Skills Canada BC and Skills Canada could put in place to help fund the cost of hosting these events in 2022.

#### Nationals 2021

The Quebec City site for hosting the Nationals 2021 has been cancelled. So, the Nationals 2021, will become remote/virtual competitions. The National 2021 competitions will not be a qualifying year for the WorldSkills 2022.

#### Nationals 2022

The National board approved rescheduling the National competitions for the next three years as follows:

- Vancouver 2022
- Winnipeg 2023
- Ontario in 2024

## **Team Canada Qualifying Event**

Skills Canada is planning to host a qualifying event, concurrent to the National competition at the Vancouver Convention Center in 2022. Each Skills Canada Member Organization will be able to self-select the competitor that will compete to get onto Team Canada in this event.

### Shanghai 2022

At this time, WorldSkills is planning on going ahead in Shanghai in either October or November 2022.

### **Audit 2020**

Audit 2020 has been completed. There is a small surplus from the 2020 operating year which is good news given the great disruption in business and industry during the pandemic.
