

WorldSkills Team Canada 2021 Competitor Selection Process

1 Identifying the WorldSkills Team Canada Competitors from the SCNC

Results from the Skills Canada National Competition (SCNC) 2021 in Québec City, will determine the competitors selected to participate on WorldSkills Team Canada (WSTC) 2021 in Shanghai, China.

1.1 Age requirements

To be invited to be a member of WSTC, competitors must meet the WorldSkills (WS) age eligibility requirements. Competitors must not be older than 22 in the year of the WorldSkills Competition (WSC). Exceptions exist in Mechatronics, Aircraft Maintenance, and Cloud Computing where competitors must not be older than 25 in the year of the WSC.

1.2 Competitors will be selected from the following SCNC skill areas to participate on WorldSkills Team Canada:

1.3 The candidates will be chosen based on the following:

The highest competitor age eligible with a rank of 1_{st} – 4_{th} place in the post-secondary (PS) level will be invited to participate on WSTC. Should a candidate decline the invitation, the invitation will be extended to the next age eligible competitor with a rank of 1_{st} - 4_{th} place in the PS level. Once the selection in the PS level is completed, the same process will apply in the secondary (S) level. If none of the age eligible competitors accept the invitation to participate, SCC will not send a competitor to the WSC in that skill.

1.3.1 Exception

CNC Machining

The above principles will apply for the selection of the competitors who will be invited to participate on WSTC but will be applied separately to the CNC Turning and CNC Milling sections of the SCNC 06-CNC Machining contest. The competitors age eligible with a rank of $1_{\rm st}-4_{\rm th}$ place in the Turning section and the competitors age eligible with a rank of $1_{\rm st}-4_{\rm th}$ place in the Milling section of the national 06-CNC Machining skill area will be invited to participate on WSTC. Therefore, the highest scoring overall competitor in the competition may not

necessarily be invited to participate on WSTC . (These criteria will not impact the awarding of the SCNC medals)

2 WorldSkills Team Canada Training/Preparation Period

Once the competitors are selected at the SCNC 2021, they, with the help of their Expert, trainer, Member Organization (MO) and the National Secretariat (NSEC), will train and prepare to compete at the WSC in Shanghai, China. Skills/Compétences Canada (SCC) will provide a training budget to assist in offsetting relevant training costs.

3 WorldSkills Competition skills areas

In order for WS to host a skill, it must reach a minimum number of competitors. If this number is not reached, the skill will not be hosted. Each WS Member Organization must provide their participation list one year before the WSC. Therefore, the participation list is subject to change.

NOTE: At any time, the above selection criteria may be modified upon a decision of a committee comprised of the Official Delegate, Technical Delegate, Technical Delegate Assistants, and CEO of SCC.
