



## 2019 REGIONAL SKILLS COMPETITION – JUDGES PACKAGE

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### CABINETMAKING

#### Secondary Level

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#### CONTEST RULES & EVALUATION

**DURATION: 6 HOURS**

Competitors work alone. This is not a team event. The suggested time for this contest is (6) hours.

The purpose of the cabinet making competition is to assess the competitor's knowledge and skill in cabinet making by building a simple project from a provided drawing. The local technical chair may elect to incorporate a theory exam, it is suggested by Skills Competences Canada that this exam not be weighted higher than 15% of the total mark. The use of the theory exam is not mandatory.

Approximately the first 15 minutes of the contest period should be used as a Contest Problem Review Meeting. Competitors are encouraged to ask questions regarding the contest project, and the shop they are working in. Coaches will not be permitted to offer advice to their competitors once the drawings have been distributed. Competitors must work independently throughout the contest period. The review will also include a shop orientation.

Each competitor will be given a set of drawings as well as the necessary materials to complete the project. If a mistake is made and they wish a new piece of material it should be possible get it from a judge who will then record this error and deduct two (2) marks from the final "project" score. For your information the suggested distribution of marks is listed below.

All submissions must be identified only by competitor number. Any other method of identification should immediately disqualify the competitor.
