



**Executive Director's Report  
October 28, 2021**

**1. ITA**

Skills BC will be receiving \$105,000 (x 3 years) from the ITA to be applied to its competitions in 2022. The ITA has invited Skills BC to apply for additional funding for items not covered in the aforementioned 3-year agreement.

Skills BC is working with the ITA to identify additional sources of funding it can apply for to support additional marketing and promotional activities in the lead up to it hosting the Nationals 2022 in Vancouver (May 25 – 28, 2022).

**2. Skills for Success Funding**

Skills BC will be receiving \$50,000 (x 2 years)

- Inspire Program \$25,000 x 2 years
- Online Challenges (\$25,000 per year x 2 years)

This funding is to be allocated to update the former “Essential Skills” materials used by Skills BC in the aforementioned programs. Funding applied to the Inspire Program can be used to pay facilitators in addition to tool and material updates.

**3. Inspire Program**

The Inspire Program vis-a-vie SIP will be receiving \$15,000 in sponsorship dollars to host Inspire presentations. SCBC will administer the program and SIP will Skills BC will be able to support the Inspire Program vis-a-vie In-kind donations of Kidder Kits (500 wind turbine and 500 bird house kits) in 2021/22. These In-kind contribution of supplies and administrative support is valued at \$25,000.

**4. AEST (Nationals 2022 – Additional Funding)**

Skills BC is working with AEST to identify additional sources of funding it can apply for to support additional marketing and promotional activities in the lead up to it hosting the Nationals 2022 in Vancouver (May 25 – 28, 2022).

**5. AEST – November Apprenticeship Recognition Month**

Skills BC is developing a schedule of activities to help AEST celebrate November Apprenticeship Recognition Month.

**6. SCBC - Nationals 2022 Planning Committee**

The first meeting of the Nationals 2022 Planning Committee was postponed until after the National Board had a chance to meet in October 2022.

**7. Social Media Accounts**

In August 2021, Skills BC’s Instagram account reached 1,006 followers on Instagram. This means that Skills BC will be able to reach bigger audiences for its YouTube channel,

Online Challenges, and all the trades and technology information that it shares in the digital space.

#### **8. Nationals 2022**

The National Office is having regular meetings with the Member Organizations to make decisions about the Nationals 2022. So far, it has been decided that the Nationals 2022 Secondary competitions will be held virtually. Planning is underway for the Nationals 2022 Post-Secondary in-person competitions at the Convention Centre.

#### **9. Nationals 2022, 2023 & 2024**

The National board approved rescheduling the National competitions for the next three years as follows:

- Vancouver 2022
- Winnipeg 2023
- Toronto 2024

#### **10. Team Canada Qualifying Event**

The National Office sent out a survey to the Member Organizations to gauge interest in various options for the Team Canada Selection event. Last week a survey was sent to the Member Organizations and a meeting was held to discuss the results. Still no firm decisions on how the Team Canada Selection Event will roll out.

#### **11. Shanghai 2022**

WorldSkills 2022 is planned for Shanghai (October 12- 17, 2022). The National Office plans to make a final decision in place about sending Team Canada to compete in Shanghai by December 2021.

#### **12. Alumni & Partner Series**

Skills Canada BC has been working with its Alumni and partners to create video content for its Inspire Program, YouTube Channel, social media feeds and newsletters. These videos tell inspiring stories about SCBC's Alumni and their journeys into the skilled trades and technology fields. New videos (below) were scheduled for release throughout the Summer of 2021.

#### **14. Team Canada Expert Selection - Skill 18 Electrical Installations**

SCBC submitted a letter of recommendation for Jason Taylor (WJETS) to become the next Team Canada Expert – Skills 18 Electrical Installations. Interviews for this position will commence early September 2021.

#### **Mobile Robotics at the SCNC 2022 and WorldSkills 2022**

The National Office proposed the creation of a Team Canada selection category at the SCNC 2022. The Member Organizations rejected this initiative as it would cost thousands of dollars for most provinces and territories to retool educators with the software and tools they would need to participate in the proposed competition. Based on this feedback the National Office has decided not to pursue creating a National Mobile Robotics team for WorldSkills 2022.

#### **15. Diversity, Inclusion and Engagement training for board and volunteers.**

British Columbia Construction Association (BCCA) hosts a “Builder’s Code” program where employers in the construction industry sign on to upload respective worksites. Builders Code employers who have signed on to program.
