Are you passionate about Skilled Trades and Technology? Show off your design and building skills with this month's **Woodworking Challenge!** This challenge is meant to further build your skill and knowledge of the craftsmanship used in the woodworking trade. All submissions must be received by *April 2, 2021 at 6:00 PM*. Good luck and have fun!

Contest Details:

- There will be 2 age groups: Grade 8 10 and Grade 11 12.
- The winners of each category will receive a **\$100 e-gift card**.
- The deadline to enter is *April 2, 2021 at 6:00 PM*.

Challenge Materials:

- Wood any type.
- Glue wood.
- Hinge for lid.

Challenge Instructions:

- The box must be made only of wood, glue and a hinge for the lid.
- Cuts are to be made, minimally and joints are to be tight.
- The box must have a wooden lid attached with a hinge, this is to be made only of wood and glue but can have additional material for decoration. (Ex: picture, burnt or stained wood, etc.)
- The box must be at least 7" cubed (L x W x H).
- Bonus points will be rewarded for additional décor, compartments, and creativity.
- Plans, measurements and a photo of the box must be submitted to <u>https://skillscanada.bc.ca/2021-online-woodworking-challenge/</u> by *April 2, 2021 at* 6:00 PM.

Important Note:

- To upload the photos, go to <u>https://skillscanada.bc.ca/2021-online-woodworking-challenge/</u>, complete the form, click BROWSE FILES and upload the photos. Don't forget to click SUBMIT when you are done.
- Photos and/or videos will be posted to Skills Canada BC social media platforms.
- Photos and videos must be appropriate for all audiences.
- Any offensive photos and/or those that request their photos not be shared, will not be posted, and are automatically disqualified.

Judging:

Submissions will be judged using the following criteria.

Did the challenger follow the criteria given? Were there little to no cuts used? Is the lid attached with a hinge? Did the challenger use any additional décor, compartments, or creativity? Did the challenger attach and follow their plans?	Points
Failed to meet all the expectations.	0-5 points
Minimally meeting expectations.	6-10 points
Fully meeting expectations.	11-15 points
Exceeding expectations.	15-20 points
BONUS points may be rewarded for going above and beyond (ex: burning wood for decor, making the box larger than required, creating compartments in the box).	0-5 points
