Show off your design and building skills with this month's **Online Paper Airplane Challenge!** This challenge is meant to further build your skill and knowledge of the craftsmanship that can be showcased and practiced within the **Aircraft and Aerospace** trades. All submissions must be received by **May 28, 2021 at 6:00 PM PST**. Good luck and have fun!

Contest Details:

- There will be 3 age groups: Grade K 3, Grade 4-8 and Grade 9-12.
- The winners of each category will receive a \$50 e-gift card.
- The deadline to enter is May 28, 2021 at 6:00 PM PST.

Challenge Materials:

- One standard letter paper. (8.5 x 11)
- Household stick items such as toothpicks, popsicle sticks and/or skewers.
- Tape for measuring the distance flown.
- Measuring tape and/or string for measuring the distance flown.
- Markers, paint, stickers and/or any decoration for your airplane.

Challenge Instructions:

- Create a plan that will give us an idea of your execution and planning process.
- Create your plane, according to your plans, using paper, sticks and decoration of your choice.
- Fly your plane! Place a piece of tape on the spot that you begin flying from and a piece of tape where the plane lands.

- Measure the distance between the two pieces of tape using a measuring tape. If the distance is too far, use a piece of string and measure the string.
- Submit a photo of your plans, your finished plane, a photo of the distance between your tape and/or a video of your plane flying.

Important Note:

- Photos and/or videos will be posted to Skills Canada BC social media platforms.

- Any offensive photos and/or those that request their photos not be shared, will not be posted and are automatically disqualified.

Judging:

Submissions will be judged using the following criteria.


