

Regional Scope Document

CARPENTRY Secondary 2023

Purpose of the Challenge:

To evaluate each contestants' ability to organize and execute a given workload safely and accurately using generally accepted carpentry practices.

Skills & Knowledge to be Tested:

- The contest will include accurate layout using basic geometry , common rafter, wall and floor framing
- Demonstrate ability and competency in reading blueprints and specifications
 Safe use of hand and power tools
 Safe use of hand and power tools
- The project will consist of general residential framing
- The project may include finishing carpentry
- The demonstration of sound work practices and assembly techniques in the building of a simple project to an acceptable standard as well at to the national building code \Box Quality, accuracy and thoroughness of workmanship.
- Ability to complete an assignment in a given time
- General safe work attitude and procedures

Specific Requirements:

- The contestant will produce a specified project to acceptable standards as determined by the judges.
- All measurements in <u>metric</u>

Safety Instructions:

Safety awareness/requirements will be maintained at minimum industry standards at all times. A contestant will not be allowed to compete without the safety equipment noted on this document. WCB regulations will be in effect.

- Portable electric circular saw
- Pair of Saw horses
- Electrical extension cord 🛛 All Required materials

Clothing Requirements:

- CSA approved safety footwear
- CSA approved hardhat
- Eye protection (CSA certified glasses or goggles)
- Hearing Protection (Deci-damps)
- Suitable work clothes (No muscle shirts or shorts long pants only)

Tools:

- Carpenter belt or Overalls
- Tape measure <u>metric</u>
- Hammer
- Chalk Line
- Utility Knife w/ Blades
- Pencils and erasers, Calculator (non- programmable)
- Framing Square
- Speed square or combination square
- Hand saw

Any other equipment or tools may be brought which you are use to using, but must be approved by the chairman at contest time.

- Ability to complete projects in a specific time period
