

Pre-Making Before the Event

Accepted Puppet Materials:

The puppet (human figure) must be made from one of the following materials:

- Modelling Clay
- Playdough
- Wire puppet:
 - Metal epoxy Putty

OR

o Foil

Making a Stop-Motion Puppet:


- A. The puppet must have the wire as its base.
- ➢ If you use Modeling Clay or Playdough, there is no need to have wire inside your character.
- Puppet height must be between 6 to 8 inches
- Draw your character
- An aluminum wire coil is an ideal material to make a stop-motion character, as it
 is a low-memory material, and exhibits high durability against bending.
- Thin gauges normally are used to make hands and hair.
- Thick gauges are used to make arms, legs, and puppets in general and make rig arms to hold small things.
- Use the drawing as a reference.
- Make the character based on the character proportion.

Materials to cover the wire puppet:

- B. Choose one of the following ways:
- 1. Foil (simple way) > Cover the wire and shape the foil to get close to your reference drawing.
- 2. **Metal epoxy Putty** > to reinforce the structure of the armature (the wire puppet).
 - This material has two parts that should be mixed, mixing them creates a chemical

reaction that allows putty to harden, and it takes up to 10 minutes to harden.

Note: Wearing gloves is essential to prevent skin damage from chemical reactions.







Polymer Clay > to cover the head after adding some aluminum foil.

 you can also use it to make the character shoes.

Bake the character in an oven for 20 minutes at no more than 130 degrees Celsius.

Colouring > To colour it, start with dark colours and then layer by layer add more colours to get the ideal result based on your drawing.

Foam & Hot Glue > to add muscles to the character.

Fabric & Hot Glue > to make the character outfit.

If you want an Aluminum Foil Puppet, ensure it has a wire inside.

Building a set:

C. Set

The Stop-Motion must have a simple set based on the story with cardboard.

- o The set must have a background wall flanked by two other walls.
- o The walls must be glued to the background wall at 90 degrees.
- o The set design must be at least 4 inches bigger than the character.
- o The set must have some props based on your story.
