CONTEST INTRODUCTION

1.1 Purpose of the Challenge:

- Students are to demonstrate their overall ability and knowledge of photography. They must submit the photo or photos for each listed style within the given time frame.

Note: The original unedited version of some photos must accompany some edited photos.

1.2 Time:

- The competition will last a maximum of 5 consecutive hours, with 30 minutes for lunch (9:00 a.m.–2:30 p.m.).

1.3 Skills & Knowledge to be tested:

- Composition
- Usage of Light
- Creativity (unique ideas)
- Post-Production (Photo editing)

1.4 Submissions: You need the following images in your folder

- Create a folder named "SkillsBC2025_Photo_Firstname_Lastname"
- Inside the above folder, competitors will place their photos for submission
- Each photo should be exported in high-res JPG at 300ppi.
- Competitors must submit a copy of the edited and the original unedited photo; *please pay attention to each section's requirements.*
- The competitor will name each JPG with the corresponding sequence:

2. CONTEST DESCRIPTION

2.1 Portrait: Portrait with Model in A Chosen Location (2 Photographs- with & without flash)

- Competitors will select a location for their portrait photography, using a model provided by the Provincial Tech Chair.
- The unlimited use of photo editing software is permitted.
- The final photograph must be submitted in JPEG format with a precise dimension of 1920 pixels on its longest edge.
- Ensure that the final photograph is named in the following format:
- 1-1Portrait-noflash-OG_FirstnameLastname.jpg

- 1-4Portrait-flash-ED_FirstnameLastname.jpg
 Edited Photo

Preparation:

- Proficiency in shooting with the available lights (without flash) and with flash.
- Effectively pose the model.

2.2 Mystery Object: (1 Photograph)

- Competitors will receive the **Mystery Object** and the **Theme** at the beginning of the competition
- Capture a photo that best represents the theme associated with the Mystery Object.
 - Competitors will be challenged to create a photograph with no preparation or foreknowledge of the subject.
 - The mystery object will be revealed at the start of competition day one.
 - The unlimited use of photo editing software is permitted.
 - Competitors must use the mystery object as the main subject, or as a major contributing element to the main subject.
 - The photograph must be taken within the designated competition area (as defined during orientation) and during competition hours (8:30 a.m. 4:00 p.m., Thursday, May 29).
 - The final photograph must be submitted in JPEG format with a precise dimension of 1920 pixels on its longest edge.
 - Ensure that the final photograph is named in the following format:

Preparation:

- Proficiency in using Adobe Photoshop and Editing
- Creativity and innovative storytelling

2.3 Minimalist: (1 Photograph)

- Take a Minimalist photo
- Your image should tell a story

No edit is needed

- Competitors shall create a compelling-colored photograph that highlights the elegance, beauty and simplicity of one of these elements of art in photography: **Colors**, **Shapes**, OR **Lines** while incorporating negative space to enhance the composition.
- The photograph must be taken within the designated competition area (as defined during orientation) and during competition hours (9:00 a.m. 2:30 p.m.).
- The final photograph must be submitted in JPEG format with a precise dimension of 1920 pixels on its longest edge.
- Competitors will be evaluated on their creativity, connection to minimalistic theme, technical proficiency, composition and impact.
- Ensure that the final photograph is named in the following format:
- 3Minimalist_FirstnameLastname.jpg



No Editing – One Photo

Preparation:

- Choose one element from "Color" or "Shape" or "Line" and brainstorm creative ideas for the minimalist composition.
- Remember that "Color" or "Shape" or "Line" can show emotion. Think about what message you are trying to convey to the viewer of your final image.
- Purposefully select an appropriate background or setting that complements the chosen subject.
- Experiment with different lighting techniques to enhance the mood and atmosphere of the photograph.

2.4 Magazine Cover: (1 Photograph)

- Use the magazine cover template provided on the given USB.
 - Based on the Title of the Magazine Cover, take a photo of the provided model OR a suitable subject (a subject that aligns with the theme and text of the magazine overlay).
- Edit the photo to make it suitable for the magazine cover
- Add the edited photo to the template.
- Use Photoshop to edit the Magazine cover and photo
- Be as creative as possible
 - Competitors will be evaluated on their proficiency in capturing, editing, and aligning an Innovative and artistic photograph from a skills competition area to complement a supplied magazine cover layout.

- Magazine cover overlay will already contain a theme based upon headlines, bylines and font layout. The overlay will be provided to you.
- Competitors must make effective use of composition to create a visually appealing photograph that complements the magazine cover overlay, adjusting cropping and positioning as needed.
- Competitors are free to choose any subject(s) that aligns with the theme and text of the magazine overlay.
- The final colour Magazine Cover must be submitted in JPEG format with a precise dimension of 613 (w) X 860 (H) pixels at 300ppi.

Submit both PSD and JPG format.

- The photograph must be taken within the designated competition area (as defined during orientation) and during competition hours (9:00 a.m. 2:30 p.m.).
- Unlimited use of editing software is permitted for post-processing.
- Competitors will be evaluated on their creativity, connection to theme, technical proficiency, composition, and alignment with the magazine cover layout.
- Ensure that the final photograph is named in the following format:

2.5 Double Exposure: (1 Photograph)

- Capture two related photos suitable for this section
- Use the double exposure technique in Photoshop to blend them together.
- Your image should tell a story

Note: Using the Blending Mode, Adjustment Layer, and Masking layer.

- Save the result as **PSD** and in **JPG** format with 300 dpi

- Submit both PSD and JPG format

- Competitors will be evaluated on their proficiency in capturing and processing a double exposure image using photo editing software.
- Competitors will create a compelling double exposure image. The final image can be in colour or black and white.
- The photographs must be taken within the designated competition area (as defined during orientation) and during competition hours (9:00 a.m. 2:30 p.m.).
- Unlimited use of editing software is permitted for merging the images and post-processing adjustments.
- The final photograph must be submitted in JPEG format, with a precise dimension of 1920 pixels on its longest edge.
- Review the competition area guidelines to ensure your chosen subjects are within the designated area.
- Competitors will be evaluated on their creativity, technical proficiency, and composition.
- The final photograph must be submitted in JPEG format, with a precise dimension of 1920 pixels on its longest edge.
- Ensure that the final photographs, the **original RAW** and **edited** files are named in the following format:
- 5-1DoubleExposure-OG_FirstnameLastname.jpg

Equipment

3.1 Equipment that the Competitor must supply:

- Bring your own device (BYOD): Personal Computer or Laptop
 - Your personal computer should have Adobe Photoshop and Lightroom
 - Students should use their own Student ID to log in with their Password to use the software
- Any Digital Camera
- Memory Card/s (other names are SD Card, Flash Card, Flash Memory Card)
- 2 x Camera Batteries
- Charger
- Lighting or Flash
- The cables and connectors for the computer
- Lenses of your choice
- Card Reader to transfer the images from Memory Card to the computer

3.2 Optional Equipment:

- Additional Lenses
- Extra Lighting
- Diffuser such as Softbox and Reflector

3. Submission Process

4.1 Submission:

- Competitors should submit both PSD and JPEG format for the 2.5 Double Exposure
- All submission folders will be copied to a USB drive provided by the contest proctor
- All submissions must be submitted by **2:30 pm**. Any submission received after 2:30 pm will have a demerit of 1 point for each minute passed.

5. EVALUATION / JUDGING CRITERIA

- 5.1 All photos will be rated into 4 categories
- 5.2 Points will be deducted if the competitor mislabels photos or submits photos in the wrong categories.
- 5.3 Point breakdown
