# Skills Canada Board Meeting - March 27, 2025

# **Competitions:**

Organization is well under way for all competition levels,

## Regionals:

- Regionals wraps up early April. Data will be provided in next meeting.

- Skills BC Team attended numerous Regionals events that weren't attended last year
  in addition to the ones in close proximity to our staff. Shoshawna and I will attend
  VCC on April 1 which will wrap up the final Regionals. Staff attending Regionals is
  well received and appreciated. Skilled Trades BC attended numerous Regionals and
  provided exhibitor booth and/or volunteers.
- Final competitor numbers will be provided after Regionals wraps up. Anticipated similar numbers to last year. Some regions started up again such as Central Interior (Junior Skills) but we would like to work on developing further for next year. New Regional Coordinator has been a great addition/contact for potential to expand this region again.
- New to this year: Regional Coordinator Reporting after Regionals. Creating a jotform with data and relevant information for SCBC.
- Short Videos have been created from Regionals competitors for the Ministry of Advanced Education and for SCBC use.

# **Programs Update:**

- Continued work with South Island Partnership (SIP) for Inspire island presentations.
- Brad Moe assisted Construction Foundation of BC with Cardboard Boat Races on January 23<sup>rd</sup> with Terry Fox Secondary at Hyde Creek Recreation Center.
- Women in Trades Conference (Peace Region, Dawson Creek) at Regionals in conjunction with Skilled Trades BC, Feb 16, 2025.
- South Fraser Trades Advisory Committee Meeting March 6. Provided SCBC update.
- Skills Canada Programming meetings are ongoing on Friday with SC March 19
- Indspire Indigenous conference, April 9 and 10. Skilled Trades BC invited SCBC to participate at the booth at no cost. As this is the week prior to Provincials, have alumni attending on behalf of SCBC.
- GW Graham Career Day April 30. Shoshawna will provide presentations 4 -45min presentations About SCBC and Careers in Baking.

## **Board Committees:**

- Ongoing meetings with various Board members for committee work for Governance, Business Development, Finance, and Executive.
- Committees to provide updates.
- All Board membership fees have been completed since AGM now.

 Ongoing meetings are continuing with Dennis Innes, Board President. Letter to Ministry of Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills, and Minister, Anne Kang to be sent shortly.

## **Sponsorship:**

- Business Development meeting held March 19.
- Continued work on existing and new potential sponsorships for 2025.
- As of March 20- sponsorship chart totals \$288,250 with CN to be added (waiting on final contract to be signed). Total to exceed over 300k. Target in budget was 220k.
- Ongoing meetings with various sponsors now regarding logistics and sponsorship fulfillment: CN, WorkSafeBC, Coast Capital, CLAC and various others.
- **Supplies and materials** chart for Provincials has been developed as well as follow up for sponsorship. Stanley Dewalt, another supplier has come on board, providing tools for cabinetmaking and welding such as power tools. Saving significant funds through the added supplies and materials being donated this year.

# **Skills Canada Operations Meetings:**

- Virtual Meetings are ongoing and next in person Operations meetings will be in June in Ottawa.
- Discussions around implementing "Skilled Futures" branding to use across the country for brand consistency and as an umbrella for programs is still in the planning/implementation stages.
- Team Canada Advisory Committee Developing a process for skills areas not currently part of National competitions to potentially participate in International competitions.
- Chatterhigh promotion: All Provinces/territories feed questions to Skills Canada who provides to Chatterhigh and students/schools compete by answering career questions.
- Marks Program working on a promotion to develop Try-A-Trade kits and top 50 list programming.

# **Conferences and Committee Participation:**

- South Fraser Trades Advisory Committee Meeting March 6. Provided SCBC update.
- Ongoing committee participation with Skills Canada, including Operations, MarComm, Programs, Business Development.

#### **Government:**

- Ministry of Future Skills and Training
  - Meeting with our liaison Adam Skulsky, April 3, 2025.
  - Adam noted in last meeting that with things just starting up, things might be a bit slow.

- Sent invite to Minister Anne Kang for Provincials in December however has declined but will provide a Minister's video greeting.
- Ongoing liaison including quote for Regionals release, which was sent out on January 28, in addition to short video snippets being produced, which they would like to utilize as well and will release shortly.

#### Skilled Trades BC

- Invoiced for \$55,000 prior March 15 and sent with deliverables.
- Working with Maureen Phung regarding the implementation for this.
- Invitation to share booth space at Indspire, Indigenous conference in Vancouver on April 9 and 10.
- Participated at some Regionals.
- Invited to speak at Partner's Luncheon, Provincials in addition to exhibitor space.

### Ministry of Education

- Daniel Tones replied to invitation that due to the current political situation, there is no travel and attendance at Provincials is not possible.
- Minister Lisa Beare also declined invitation to attend.

## • Government of Canada - ESDC funding through Skills Canada

- Mona Soleimani and I are preparing and submitting ongoing quarterly reporting to Skills Canada. January 15 last report due and next quarterly report due is April 15.
- Renewal at this point will not include an increase and will be the same as previous years. Working on details with Skills Canada accountant and Mona Soleimani.
